

#### NCDHM History

The annual observance of children's dental health began as a one-day event in Cleveland, Ohio on February 3, 1941 and a one-week event in Akron, Ohio during February 1941.

The American Dental Association held the first national observance of Children's Dental Health Day on February 8, 1949. The single day observance became a week-long event in 1955. In 1981, the program was extended to a month-long celebration known today as National Children's Dental Health Month.

Today, NCDHM is a nationwide program and its messages reach millions of people in communities across the country and at numerous armed service bases abroad. Local observances often include poster, coloring, and essay contests, health fairs, free dental screenings, museum exhibits, classroom presentations and dental office tours.

The theme for this year's campaign is "Get a Gold Medal Smile," featuring two sets of twins -Flossy and Buck McGrinn and Den and Gen Smiley.

# 2012 Legislative Victories HB 1537 & SB 1144 Prohibiting insurers from capping non-covered dental services

In October, Pennsylvania became the 27th state to pass legislation prohibiting insurers to cap noncovered dental services. This significant victory against the insurance industry illustrates the strength of organized dentistry in the legislative areas and signals an era in which we have taken a step toward leveling the playing field against insurance companies. For three years, our lobbyists, staff and members educated about the unfairness of this insurance practice and lobbied for its prohibition. We overcame strong opposition from the insurance carriers to garner support from key legislators from the House and Senate who championed our cause.

#### HB 532

#### Requiring insurers to cover general anesthesia for young children and patients with special needs

Collective efforts paid off. HB 532 unanimously passed the House of Representatives and Senate, then was signed into law by Governor Corbett on July 5.

For more than a decade and seven legislative sessions, PDA poured a significant part of its advocacy resources into lobbing for legislation which requires all insurers to cover under their medical policies the costs associated with administering general anesthesia to children seven years of age and younger and patients of any age with developmental disabilities. PDA's lobbyists and staff worked with key members of the House Democratic and Republican caucuses to advance this legislation. Members routinely answered calls to action and contacted their legislators to request support for the bill. PDA also worked with organizations that advocate on behalf of Pennsylvanians with special needs.
