Dr. Goodchild maintains a private general dental practice in Jenkintown, PA.

Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office: What's in Your Emergency Kit and Why? Overview

Preparing the Entire Dental Team to Manage Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office Medical emergencies are defined as any condition that if left untreated may lead to patient morbidity or mortality. However, if your definition of an emergency is any condition of a patient that raises your blood pressure or

pulse rate - then you need to take this course! Medical emergencies happen. Studies estimate that on average a practitioner will be faced with a medical emergency in the dental office twice every year! Some of these occurrences can be minor; some of these situations can be life-threatening. The good news for practitioners is that 75% of emergencies can be mitigated by good local anesthesia (pain control) and effective stress reduction. For those few instances when an appropriate response could be lifesaving, each practitioner must be prepared with a properly equipped emergency drug kit. The purpose of the course is to emphasize patient safety and educate you on the seven essential drugs you should have in the medical emergency kit. Even though the right answer always includes dialing 9-1-1, you can start the chain of survival in your office!

Achieving profound and effective local

anesthesia is essential in clinical practice. It is a limiting step in most procedures; meaning invasive procedures cannot commence until it is successfully achieved. Despite the frequency that oral health providers (ie, dentists and hygienists) use local anesthetics during clinical practice, misconceptions remain.

The goal of this presentation is to discuss several common 'myths' surrounding local anesthesia while incorporating literature-supported learning issues. Wednesday, March 13, 2024 - Opioids, Addiction and Pain Management Alternatives; Also, Hot Button Drug Topics of Importance to Dentistry – 2024

Presenter

Richard Wynn, PhD, Professor of Pharmacology, Dental School, University of Maryland, Baltimore

Richard L. Wynn, PhD is Professor of Pharmacology at the Dental School, University of Maryland, Baltimore. He was awarded the BS (Pharmacy), MS (Physiology) and PhD (Pharmacology) degrees all from the University of Maryland. He chaired the Department of Pharmacology at the University of Maryland Dental School from 1980 to 1990, and the Departments of Pharmacology and Biochemistry, 1990 to 1995. Previously he chaired the Department of Oral Biology at the University of Kentucky Dental School in Lexington. He has to his credit over 400 publications including original research articles, textbooks, book chapters, and monographs. He has given continuing education seminars since 1980 to dental professionals in the US, Canada, Mexico and Europe. Dr. Wynn has been a consultant to the drug industry for 25 years and his research laboratories have contributed to the development of fentanyl-type intravenous anesthetics, inhalant anesthetics and agents for control of chemotherapyinduced nausea. He had previous consultantships with the Academy of General Dentistry, and the American Dental Association. He was the featured pharmacology columnist for the journal General Dentistry for 20 years. He is the lead author and chief editor of

Drug Information Handbook for Dentistry, since its inception, now in its 29th edition, published by LexiComp, Inc/WoltersKluwer. He is the lead content author and chief editor for the Lexicomp Online Dental Web applications including its Web platform along with Iphone, Ipad and Android. He is the consultant to the Maryland State Board of Dental Examiners in course development for opiate prescribing and disposal for Maryland licensees. His chief interest is teaching pharmacology to dental and dental hygiene students, and in keeping dental professionals informed of current and new drug information relative to dental practice.

Overview

This fast-paced course will present an update of the latest drug and supplement information of importance to dentistry. Pennsylvania dentists with a DEA registration need two hours in one or a combination of all three of the following subjects - identification of addiction, opioid prescribing practices, and/or pain management alternatives. This course is approved for providing the necessary two hours of instruction (Pennsylvania Act 124 Opioid Requirement). To round out to a full day's course, the following hot topics will also be presented: antibiotic stewardship and odontogenic infections, current American Heart Association guidelines for premedication as of May 2021, orthopedic premedication guidelines

from 2017, marijuana and the marijuana licensing industry, an in depth oral surgery position paper on review of medication related osteonecrosis of the jawbone, and nutraceutical supplements including vitamin D, and fish oil and top 12 vitamins/supplements necessary for well-being. Finally, mixed messages on the benefits of moderate alcohol consumption will be described. The presenter will provide a paper handout of the day's topics.

Objectives

- describe the role that dental practitioners play in preventing prescription drug abuse, prescription drug addiction and ways of mitigating addiction through use of Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs
- describe the latest guidelines for antibiotics in treating odontogenic infections
- describe the American Heart Association guidelines as of 2021 for premedicating the "heart" patient
- list the ten information items describing "where we are" relative to osteonecrosis of the jawbone
- list the National Science Foundation purported medical benefits and adverse reactions of medical marijuana
- list the top twelve hot button vitamins and supplements described in this program
 - describe the current findings on effects of daily moderate alcohol consumption.
