
General Meeting Featuring Dr. Carolyn Serio

The Scranton District Dental Society (SDDS) is pleased to announce that it has selected Emma Zipprich as the 2024 recipient of both the Dr. Todd M. Angelo Memorial Scholarship and the Dr. Bernard Shair Memorial Scholarship Award.

The Dr. Todd M. Angelo Memorial Scholarship is a cash gift funded by the SDDS, The Scranton Area Foundation, and private donations in memory of Dr. Todd Angelo who suddenly passed away in November 2011. The scholarship is administered by the Scranton Area Foundation and presented to a University of Scranton student who has been accepted by a dental school and who shows tremendous promise in the field of dentistry. This award serves as a reflection of Dr. Angelo's dedication, service and love of dentistry.

The Dr. Bernard Shair Memorial Scholarship Award is a cash gift funded by the SDDS and an endowment fund founded by the family of Dr. Bernard Shair (who passed away in 1982) and administered by the Scranton Area Foundation. It is presented to a University of Scranton student who has been accepted by a dental school and shows tremendous promise in the field of dentistry.

Zipprich will graduate from the University of Scranton in May 2024 with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology. A resident of Hop Bottom, Pennsylvania, Zipprich is a member of the Tri-Beta Biological Honor Society and serves as the Pre-Dental Chair of the University's Health Professions Organization (HPO). She is also a member of the University's Biology Club, Commuter Student Association, Physiology Club, and "Ready, Set, Brush!" (a community outreach program to young students about the importance of oral care).

Zipprich has also served as a Susquehanna County 4-H Leader and Second Vice President of the Harford Agricultural Society Youth Board. She is the daughter of Paul and Bonnie Zipprich and will be attending University of Pittsburgh School of Dental Medicine.
